I ran across this article written by our Sunday School director Cindy Laurin, written October 17, 2010. I am blessed to serve under her and her husband Mike's leadership for over 20 years, and their burden and compassion to teach and tell these children about God's word and about God's love have impacted hundreds, probably thousands. Thanks for all you've done and continue to do!

Give me a **J**. Give me a **E**. Give me a **S**. Give me a **U**. Give me a **S**. What you got? **JESUS!** What? **JESUS!** Louder. **JESUS!** I can remember many times being in a children's service and chanting this cheer—The children screaming with excitement, seeing who could be the loudest. I'm sure most of the children screaming out those letters really weren't thinking about the greatness of God, just who could be the loudest! But last Sunday morning in Super Church with our Sunday School children, as the song "How Great Is our God," began to play, and they began to sing along; I watched as all of a sudden the Spirit of the Lord swept in. Hands began to raise from the youngest to the oldest, tears began to flow, and praise and worship began to come from their lips. **The Spirit came down!** Four of our children received the Holy Ghost and many were refilled. It was such an awesome sight to see! Young children ages five and six years old were raising their hands, smiling, not fully understanding what to do, and immediately I watched their expressions change as the Spirit of the Lord came upon them. God is no respecter of persons. If we will have a willing and open heart, He will come in and bless at any age.

You might ask, "Can God really change a child's life?" As a child of 11 years old, Jesus filled me with this precious gift, and He's still filling me 42 years later. Some people might ask, "Why bother with the children? They're too young and don't even understand about God." But as we look in the word of God, we find that He called many while they were young: David, Samuel, and Josiah. We don't have to be wise and full of great understanding to have Jesus come into our hearts and lives.

I'm thankful for our church and their open hearts to our children. If we of the church don't teach them and show them how to open up to the Spirit of God, the world certainly will show them the things of the world. We can't let that happen. If we say that we have the love of God in our hearts and turn them away, we have failed. We must not let them down. As Philip asked the Ethiopian eunuch in Acts 8, "Understandest thou what thou readest?" and he replied, "How can I, except some man should guide me?" 






It's Time For... Candy!!!
